

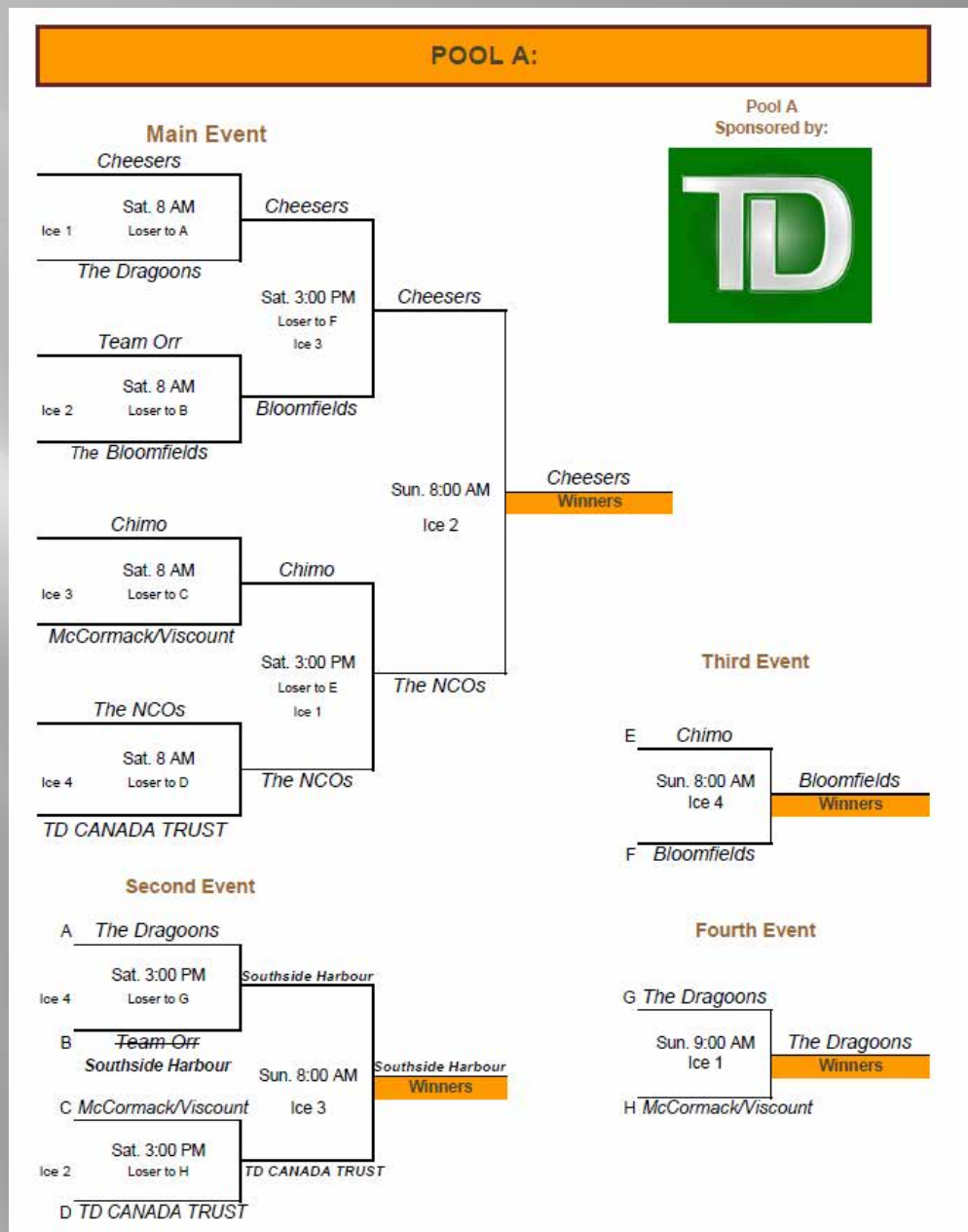


Each pool was composed of 8 teams which played off in an 8 team format.

If teams lost their second game, they continued to play until the Finals on Sunday

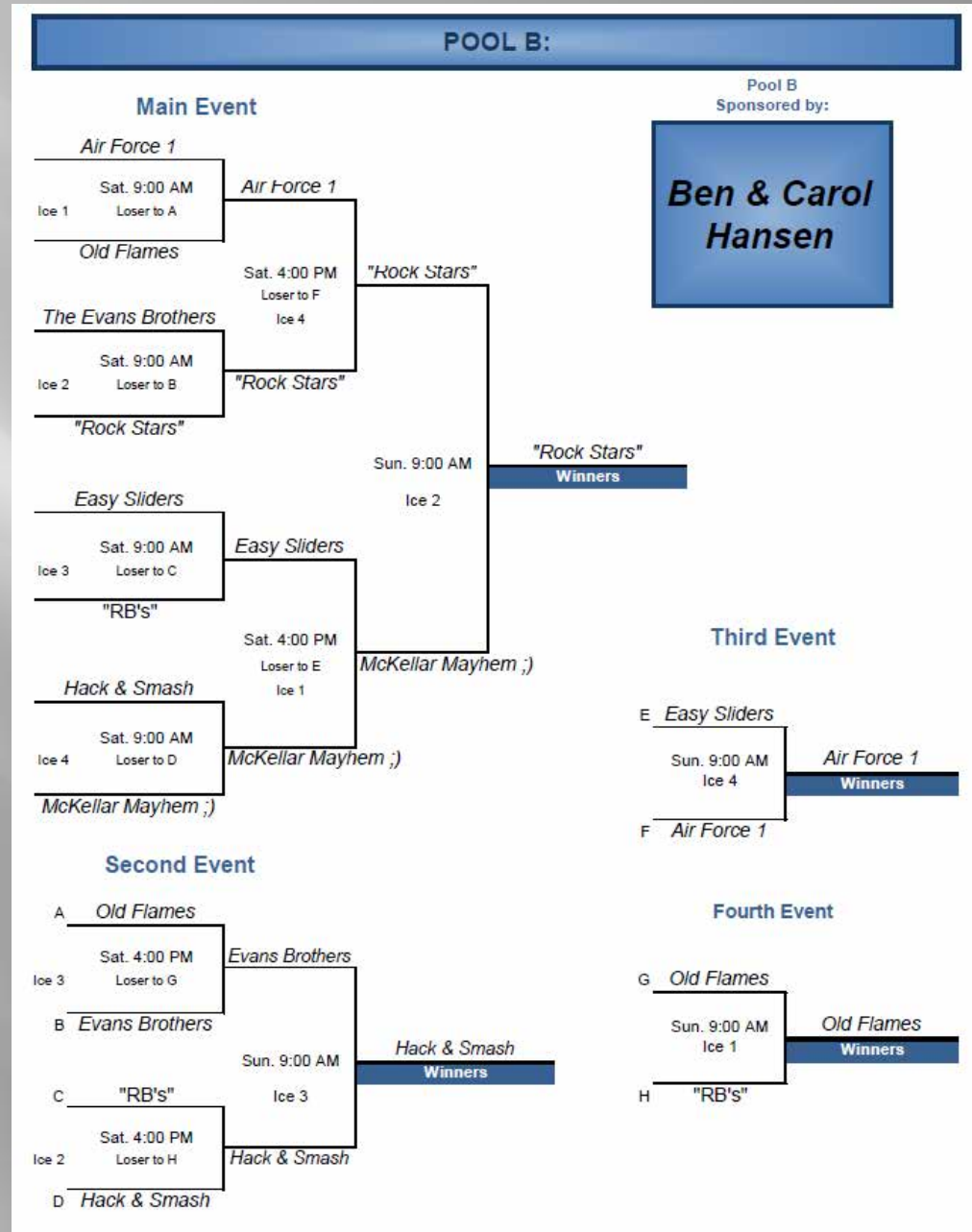
All teams in a pool ended up Winning an event or Runner-up in that event. There were no losers.



Draw Sheets:

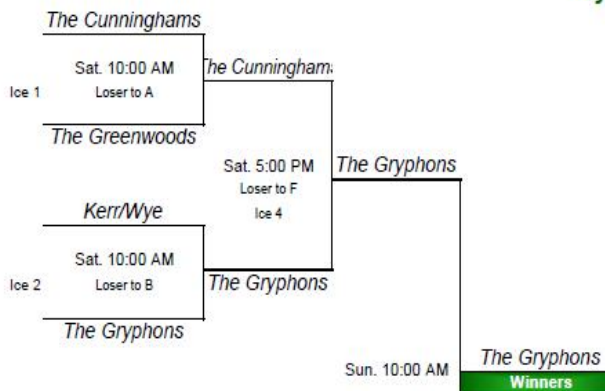
Each pool was 'colour-coded' to make it easier for keeping pools and times straight.

Fourth Event

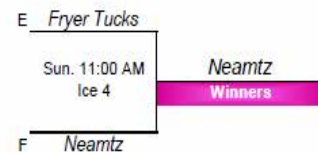

Main Event



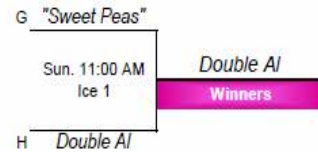

The Air Cadets:
